

- 80.6% Retention Rate Fall 2015 to Fall 2016
 Up from 79% Fall 2014 to Fall 2015

- 7 Conference Championships an FSC record!
- 45% of student-athletes had GPA of 3.0 or higher





Solving the "Brain Drain" on Long Island

FSC programs meet the needs of Long Island.

- 89% who earned baccalaureate degree reported being employed.
- 80% indicated they are working full-time.
- 88% of 2015-16 working graduates employed in NYC metro, with majority working on LI.







- NCLEX pass rate: 94.75%; National: 84.57%
- 100% written Dental Hygiene; 94% on clinical
- Flying Rams won northeast regional competition for fourth straight year
- 93% Graduate School admission rate for Applied Psychology grads who applied




