

Top 5 Things You Need to Know

- 1. All students with an on-campus presence or plan to use the campus facilities at minimum must be fully vaccinated with an initial COVID-19 vaccination series.
- 2. Students must be fully vaccinated for at least two weeks prior to the start of class on Monday, August 29, 2022. Your vaccination must be verified through SUNY's vaccination upload form of.
- 3. Students who fail to comply with the vaccine mandate and are not given a medical or religious exemption by August 29, 2022 will be disenrolled from in-person classes and subject to the refund policy.
- 4. Medical or religious exemptions may be requested by qualifying students. In order to have an exemption request considered, students must submit such requests within 5 business days of your initial registration or June 30, 2022 whichever is later. Exemption forms can be found under the Resources & Forms section on the bottom of this page. Submissions will not be considered if submitted via any other format.
- 5. Students participating in applied learning experiences will be required to comply with the vaccination policies of their host site. This includes all levels of clinical and allied health training and educator preparation.











- However, the graduation rate of White and Asian students is lower than the SUNY average.


