

Student Immunization Policy

New York State law requires all students born on or after January 1, 1957, who are attending an institution of higher education to show proof of immunity to measles, mumps and rubella.

Proof of Immunity is as follows:

Measles: Proof of two measles immunizations after one year of age and at least one

month apart; OR physician documentation of measles disease; OR a blood test (titers) showing positive immunity to measles. A copy of the titer report must be

submitted.

Mumps: proof of one mumps immunization after one year of age; OR physician

documentation of mumps disease; OR a blood test (titers) showing positive

immunity to mumps. A copy of the titer report must be submitted.

Rubella: Proof of one rubella immunization after one year of age; OR a blood test (titers)

showing positive immunity to rubella. A copy of the titer report must be

submitted.

Meningitis: *A valid meningitis vaccine is required for all students residing on campus.

Accepted documents include an official immunization record from a physician or clinic, this form must be **SIGNED** and **STAMPED**, high school, college or university, military, or laboratory reports demonstrating immunity.

NYS Law also requires that ALL students read and complete an informational letter about Meningitis. This form must be completed in its entirety and returned to the Health & Wellness Center.

NOTE: ALL immunization requirements must be fulfilled prior to registering for classes.
